Nunavut has been collaborating with Yukon, the Northwest Territories, and Team Canada to address the potential threat of U.S tariffs on Canadian goods.



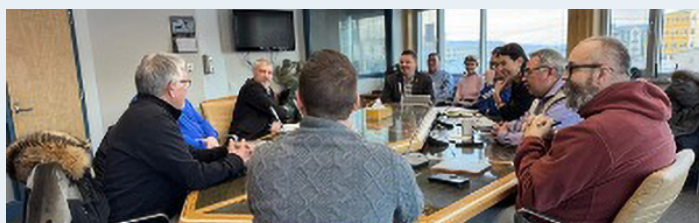
Canada's Premiers visit Washington

On February 12th, Canada's premiers met with key members of the new United States Administration, Congress, and business leaders to advocate for maintaining strong Canada-U.S. relations. Premier P.J. Akeeagok also participated in meetings with U.S. and Danish representatives to discuss shared priorities, including economic development and Arctic security.

Premier P.J. Akeeagok joined fellow Canadian premiers on January 15th for a meeting with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau to discuss Canada's relationship with the United States. The discussions focused on protecting Canada's economy and addressing concerns around potential tariffs. Federal government funds Iqaluit hydroelectricity project

On February 4th, federal Minister Anandasangaree announced a \$6 million investment to support Nunavut Nukkiksautiit Corporation's Iqaluit Hydroelectric Project. This funding will advance the engineering and design work needed to develop a sustainable water power plant near Iqaluit, marking a significant step towards clean energy in Nunavut.
